You Build Your Story

Builders are skilled in planning and constructing high and mid-rise buildings, bridges, and roads. They are equipped with the proper training needed to pass the standards of

building codes. Builders are keen to details because their license will be at stake when their works don't meet the set standards.

Builders are not limited to only those in the construction firm or sites making you competent to be a builder too. You are inevitably the builder of your own story. No one else will be responsible for building a constructive story.

Leaders and visionaries can be called "builders" of their generation. When you look at the leaders of yesterday and today, they are builders of sorts. Bill Gates and Steve Jobs are examples of those leaders who planned, execute, and made a huge impact during their time. Similarly, you can be one. You can be the builder of your own life.¹

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How can you be a "builder" in your own story? Definitely, you need to have a vision. Vision is the key in seeing a future for your context. Anything exceptional that you wish to attain starts with having a vision. Hope exudes when you have a vision and you can easily overcome the struggles that will block your way. Avoid having a limited vision for it can cowardly pull you off your desired path.

Lack of vision is caused by two things: past failures and past successes. Sometimes, it's the pain of previous failures that halts our progress. You must keep in mind that these failures lead you to good experiences. Other times, we are blinded complacency with the past successes that we had. Stop with these thoughts. People who dared to go beyond their present circumstances build a more constructive identity. Elevating your vision will make your stories work for you.

New Interpretations Makes a Transformed Being

Transformation of one's self involves a dissertation in your way of being to achieve a radical change. Author David Bohm and Mark Edwards explain, "At this point, we can say that whenever something happens that causes people to question their thought seriously, for that moment they are beginning to awaken perception. They're not just running the disks automatically. Up till now the disks ran automatically, producing the answers that would make people feel better."

We come to a point in our lives when we find ourselves asking new set of questions. We have queries we didn't bother to ask before. And these questions came to you when you are opening yourselves for new sets of interpretations.

The core of a transformed being lies within new interpretations. For many people, going through the daily routines in life becomes the substitute for self-discovery. Exploration of self has sadly been replaced with monotonous work. Our daily tasks make us stagnant which results in expulsion of transformation. But what does it take to transform one's self? What interpretations do you need?¹

Awakening to new interpretations is the main aspect of personal transformation. To transform one's identity, you make interpretations the central focus. This becomes the core which focuses on life's purpose, seeing both objective and subjective points, and having an everyday conversation with your being.

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New interpretations take place when questions revolve around the person's direction, purpose of being, and the results produced. Having new interpretations creates a transformed way of being open for radical change. Ask yourselves now. What direction are you heading? Is the purpose of your story clear to you? Develop an Open-minded Trait

There will always be situations where we really need a developed trait of openness. In order to keep the mutual respect and trust in relationships, being open with your spouse about absolutely anything is very important in marriage. Leading a team is another example where you should practice having an open-minded trait. Being a leader shouldn't be a one-sided approach. Many leaders who fail to understand a team member's concern most likely fail in his capacity to be open. Valuing openness escalates leadership skills. Stop Rationalizing

Rationalization is the act of making excuses. It is the process of coming up with apparently rational explanations for a certain behavior after employing that behavior or having begun to employ it. It makes your actions biased and the series of events not aligned to your direction.

Unknowingly, rationalizing is a thing you do habitually. It is often brought about by fear, anxiety, and insecurity. You may not be aware but rationalization is a parasite on your stories. It usually leads to negative implications on your way of being.

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We belong to the modern day generation which acquires a new level of thinking. And this trend is now aiming to reject rationalism. As our knowledge broadens, we look for something bigger, opening ourselves to the rich source of interpretations which can alter our way of being.

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Rationalization corrupts our identity and stories. The people who rationalize have the most tedious and frustrating life. And since they are unconscious to reality, they usually make bad decisions and their growth impedes. The act of rationalizing is justifying your actions when things are obviously becoming negative elements of your being. When you already lose track, stop for a while and learn to accept mistakes. There is nothing wrong with committing mistakes. Nobody's perfect. We are bound for errors.²

Assess your interpretations of your story and your identity. Check if it is rationalizing in any way and make a decision to stop. It was written in Jeremiah 17:9, "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately sick; who can understand it?" Where do you begin when you decide to stop? Start by being honest with yourself. In combating rationalization, honesty is really the best policy. Keep in mind that rationalizing is always critical in your stories and in your way of being.

Lose Yourself in the Service of Others

Have you ever thought of doing something out of what you normally do? Have you checked other things you can do to make your story worth telling? Were you able to render service for other people? Service is best done to shape your way of being. The act of service requires commitment and this loses yourself in the process. Commitment is about declaring your passion to something that is bigger than yourself, that's why it was considered "losing of self". Oxford further defined commitment as a state of being dedicated to a cause. Jean-Paul Sartre once said, "*Commitment is an act, not a word.*"

Getting committed to something is a choice you make. It is a decision. The best example of a committed man is Mahatma Gandhi. He was illustrated as an ordinary man, but he went on to do things that maybe he, himself thought impossible. Many leaders were ahead of him during his time but he outshone them all – simply because of his commitment. Another leader who portrayed a great act of commitment was Nelson Mandela. He was in prison for 27 years but, his commitment to a united and free South Africa never wavered.¹ The key to being committed is to be willing to be sacrificed and to be used to something bigger than yourself.

Our unconscious limitations get in the way and eats up our motivation and desire. When you start to be committed to something bigger that will make you lose your old ways, it should be a life-long decision. Commitment to do service doesn't only sound huge. It requires huge responsibility.

Entering into the world of action is definitely a shift in your views and beliefs. You will then participate and engage with your context in a more meaningful way.

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

The main point of this quote - you can receive perceptions of others about you, but how you define yourself will solely be based on how you take those perceptions. It's all in the mind.
